Give 4 Life Program



Through the Narayana Hrudayalaya Foundations and chain of hospitals across India, Narayana Health is committed towards provision of healthcare to patients from lower socio-economic status. The Give4Life program was conceptualised to enable corporates, philanthropic institutions and individuals to join NH in our journey towards providing monetary support for those patients unable to afford healthcare expenses or facing catastrophic medical expenses. The catastrophic nature of expenses is especially pervasive in cancer treatment. Therefore we are indebted that Sri Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT) has joined our journey in enabling monetary support for cancer patients in particular.

The following care narratives highlight the background and clinical condition of those patients whose cancer treatment has been funded from the SRTT grant.

Amala Borai

Mrs. Amala Borai, a female aged 47 years is a resident of Uttarpara, Ashrampur Bamangola, West Bengal. She is married to Kshitish CH Borai and is having two sons, elder son Biplab Borai who is married to Usha Borai and younger son Bishwajit Borai is pursuing higher secondary education. She has a grand daughter and a grandson and lives in a small house with all the family members in Uttarapura.



Her Husband and eldest son does agriculture in their little farm and are the sole source of income earning 3000/- per month to support the five-member household. Amala Borai with MRN no. 10020000935677 was diagnosed with carcinoma cervix stage III (HPR squamous cell carcinoma) which has a high cure rate if treated on time. The treatment for her condition is a type III radical hysterectomy with bilateral nodal dissection and surgery which would cost the family 1,50,000/- five times their annual income, which was beyond the paying capacity of the seven-member poor household.

The family could collect 1,00,000/- by gathering funds, savings and through public insurance and needed another 50000/- for the surgery to be done. They approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT has funded the remaining amount of 50000/- that is required for the surgery.

The surgery was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Baseer Ahmed

Mr. Basheer Ahmed, a male aged 35 years is a resident of Bhagalkot Karnataka. He lives with his wife, Sameena who is a house wife, three sons, a daughter and his parents, Anusab and Rajma. Mr. Baseer Ahmed is a vegetable salesman and is the bread winner of the family. He along with his younger brother, also a vegetable salesman got their both sisters married.

Basheer Ahmed with MRN number 10020000918514, is a diagnosed case of carcinoma maxilla, he is planned to take treatment of Three-Dimensional Conformal Radiotherapy (3DCRT) of 33 fractions for a period of 6½ weeks which would cost him 1,02,400/- The amount for the treatment was beyond the paying capacity of the poor vegetable salesman supporting the seven-member household including his aged parents and his young children.



Mr. Basheer collected an amount of 30,000/- with the help of his family, and he needed another 72,400/- for the treatment to be done. The family approached the Medico-social department of Mazumdar Shah Hospital where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Shri Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). Sir Ratan Tata Trust has funded the remaining amount of 72,400/- required for the 3DCRT treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Shantamma

Mrs. Shanthamma, a female, widow, 35 years old is a resident of Maddur, Mysore, Karnataka. She has two daughters Arpita, who is married and a homemaker, Harshita, who is pursuing her education. Mrs. Santhamma's husband had expired 14 years back in a road traffic accident and from then on, she has taken the responsibility of the two daughters and is struggling to lead a happy life.



Mrs. Shanthamma is a flower seller and is earning 17,000/- annually. she is the bread winner of the family supporting daughter's education and the household needs by taking up all kinds of Jobs when needed. She was diagnosed with Paraosteal Osteosarcoma-localised (post operation) with MRN no 10020000902819. The treatment for her condition is Chemotherapy with inj. Cisplatin and inj. Adriamycin for every 3 weeks for 6 cycles which would cost her 60,000/- which was beyond the paying capacity of poor flower seller.

Mrs. Shantamma could collect 15,000/- from her saving and the support of her relatives and was in short of 45,000/- for the treatment to be done. She approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT has funded the remaining amount of 45,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Bhaskar

Mr. Bhaskar, a male aged 52 years is a resident of Hakladi village, Udupi district Karnataka. He lives with his wife Sharadha, who is a home maker, son Sachin, employed in a workshop, daughter Sneha, pursuing PUC education and his parents Subba and Kaveri both unemployed. Mr. Bhaskar's son Sachin is suffering from low white blood cell count, the treatment of which had cost the family 1,00,000/- in the past.



Mr. Bhaskar is the bread winner of the family and the annual income of the family is 18,000/-. The treatment cost of his son left the family with no saving when Mr. Bhaskar with MRN no. 10020000933395 was diagnosed with Renal cell carcinoma with bone mets. The treatment of the condition Conformal Radiotherapy Technique of 5 fractions over a period of one week which would cost him 12,000/-.

The amount for the treatment was impossible to pay for the six-member household who has recently experienced a catastrophic health expenditure for the treatment of Bhaskar's son Sachin. They approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT has funded the remaining amount of 12,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Rajendran

Mr. Rajendran, 45 years old is a resident of K.G Halli Bangalore. He lives with his wife Vijaya, a homemaker, three sons, Naveen, Chandran and Rahul, pursuing their education and his father, Shyam who is unemployed. Rajendran's mother had cancer for which the family had spent 1.6 lakhs but could not save her.

Mr. Rajendran is uneducated and earns 41,000/- per annum, he is the bread winner of the family and supports his aged father and the education of his children. Rajendran with MRN no. 10140000131346 was diagnosed with Anaplastic Oligodendroglioma and is planned for treatment of Three-Dimensional Conformal Radiotherapy (3DCRT) which would cost him 72,000/-.



The family had experienced a catastrophic health expenditure by spending 1.6 lakhs on the treatment of Rajendran's mother and was able to collect only 40,000/- for the treatment and she needs 32,000/- more for the treatment. He approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT has funded the remaining amount of 32,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Sanjit

Mr. Sanjit. H.S, 21 years old is a resident of Nagasandra, Bangalore. He lives with his father Mr. Swamy, Mother Bhagya and younger sister Sushma who is pursuing Ilyear PUC. Mr. Swami, works as a tailor and his wife is working at a nearby garment factory. The family lives in a rented house earning 12,000/- per month supporting the education of the two children.

Mr. Sanjit with MRN 10020000861205 was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic syndrome. He requires donor lymphocyte infusion and Induction chemotherapy which would cost him 12,00,000/- rupees to get treated. They have already utilized the benefit under ESI and were able to gather 3,00,000 from different sources. After getting discount from the hospital they were able to gather remaining amount and need another 40,000/-.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 40,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Ravi

Mr. Ravi aged 21 years is a resident of Elwala hobli, Mysore. He is the eldest son in the four-member family. The five members of the family had to work to earn a monthly income of 11,000.

Mr. Ravi with MRN 10140000129753 was diagnosed with Non-Metastatic Osteosarcoma of distal femur and requires chemotherapy and surgical resection with mega prosthesis reconstruction. The treatment would cost the family 4,90,000/- which is five times their annual income. The amount was beyond the paying capacity of the five-member household who had already spent 3,00,000/- rupees on preliminary tests. They were able to gather funds from the various sources and would require financial support of another 60,000/- rupees.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 60,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Kumari Siddhamma

Mr. Sannakeppa is a resident of Shorapur Taluk, Yadagir district. He is married to Mallamma and has two daughters Sridevi and Siddhamma. He works as a daily wage labourer earning 1000/- per month. The four member household had already catastrophic healthcare expenditure for her daughter's surgery.

Kumari Siddhamma elder daughter of Sannakeppa with MRN number 10020000874710 was diagnosed with Griselli syndrome for which she underwent bone marrow transplantation and she now requires post-transplant follow up for next 6 months. The treatment would cost the family 1, 50, 000/- which is beyond the paying capacity of the poor family They were able to collect 1,00,000/- rupees through various sources and needed another 50,000/-.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 50,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Kumari Priyanka Kulkarni

Mr. Raghavendra Kulkarni is a resident of Bengaluru. He is married to Kavitha and has two daughters, he works in BEL as a hardware operator. The monthly income of the family is 25,000/- supporting the family needs and education of two daughters.

Kumari Priyanka younger daughter of Mr. Raghavendra with MRN number 10020000924271 was diagnosed with high risk positive acute lymphoblastic leukaemia and she requires treatment with high risk BFM protocol as she is prone to febrile neutropenia. The treatment would cost the family 15,00,000/- which is beyond the paying capacity of the family. They could gather funds through CM & PM funds, NGOs and other sources and needed another 50,000/- rupees to complete the treatment.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 50,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Atanu Pandit

Mr. Atanu Pandit aged 29 years is a resident of Debidasapur, West Bengal. He moved to Bengaluru along with his wife Anjana Pandit and started working as a cook in households. He is the only source of income for the family earning 11,000/- rupees per month.

Mr. Atanu Pandit with MRN number 10020000957878 was diagnosed with Lung tumour and requires lower lobectomy treatment which would cost him 1,75,000/- rupees. He was able to gather 80,000/- rupees from various sources and a 20% concession was provided by the Mazumdar Shah Medical Foundation. He needed another 50,000/- rupees for the treatment for which he approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 50,000/- that is required for the treatment.



The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Santu Rana

Mr. Santu Rana, aged 26 years is a resident of Imam Patna, West Bengal. He is married to Shravya and has daughter Shreya. He is part of a joint family and lives with his father and brother. The whole family does agriculture earning 3,000/- per month.

Mr. Santu Rana with MRN 10020000909610 was diagnosed with Hodgkins Lymphoma one and half year back and had spent upto 4,00,000/- rupees on treatment. He now requires 2 cycles of salvage chemotherapy followed by autologous Bone Marrow transplant which would cost him 10,00,000/- rupees. The amount was beyond the paying capacity of the small farmer who had already experienced catastrophic healthcare expenditure.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 35,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Seenappa

Mr. Seenappa, aged 56 years is a resident of Jarugu, Andhra Pradesh. He is married to Shanthamma and has 4 daughters and a son. He is the bread winner of the family doing Agriculture in their farm land earning 18,000/- rupees per year.

Mr. Seenappa with MRN 10020000916072 was diagnosed with Squamous cell carcinoma of left orbit and requires treatment of conventional radiotherapy of 33 fractions for 6 ½ weeks. The cost of treatment is 48,000/- rupees which is beyond the paying capacity of the poor farmer who has to support his six-member household. The family were able to gather 13,000/- rupees from various sources and require 35,000/- rupees for the treatment.



The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 35,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Susamita Das

Ms. Susamita Das, aged 16 years is a resident of Kamaskhyaguri, West Bengal. She is the younger daughter of Mr. Rebat Das and Mrs. Chinu Das. She is pursuing her Ist in arts subject. Mr. Rebat das is the bread winner of the family earning a monthly income of 2,500/- . He is a vegetable seller and owns a petty shop in West Bengal. He has to support the education of his three daughters with the little income.



Ms. Susamita Das with MRN 10080000110455 was diagnosed with Ovarian Mass S/O mucinous cyst stage I/II and requires surgery followed by chemotherapy if required. The treatment would cost the family 1,85,000/- rupees which is beyond the paying capacity of the five-member household who are already struggling to exist. They could gather 1,00,000/- rupees through various sources and require further support to get the treatment done.

The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 40,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Baby Nethra

Baby Nethra, female aged 3 years is a resident of Gulbarga, Hirapur, Karnataka, she is the only daughter of Kedranath, and Preethi who are aged 38 and 30 years respectively and has a younger brother named Gagan who is One and a half years old.

Her father is a professional contractor who earns 11,000 per annum who is the sole source of income, to support the 4-member family. Baby Netra with MRN no. 10020000731158 was diagnosed with S/P Endoscopic Third Ventriculostomy Obstructive Hydrocephalus Secondary to Aqueduct Stenosis. The treatment for her condition is ETV surgery which would cost the family 1,00,000/- nine times their annual income, which was beyond the paying capacity of the four-member middle socio economical family.

The family could contribute 50,000/- by gathering funds, savings and public insurance and was in need of another 50000/- for the surgery to be done. The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 50,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Gita Mondal

Mrs. Gita Mondal, a female aged 54 years is a resident of Khordakaibati, Raidogachia Bardhaman, West Bengal. She is married to Banesan Mondal, 60 and has two sons, namely Sanjay Mondal, 35 and Prashanth Mondal, 32. They are married to Deepa, 26 and Santana, 19 respectively. Mr. Sanjay and Deepa Mondal have a son, Ritam aged 5years and a daughter, Sneha who is 5 months old.



Her Husband and both the sons do agriculture in their little farm land that is the sole source of income, Rs 36000 /- per annum to support the 8 family members. Gita Mondal with MRN no. 10020000943427 was Thymoma if Supraclavicular. The treatment for her condition is Wide Excision + Sternotomy surgery which would cost the family 1,10,000/- five times their annual income, which was beyond the paying capacity of the eight-member poor household.

The family got a concession of 40000 from GIVE FOR LIFE and was able to collect 35000/- to 40000 by gathering funds, savings and public insurance and was in need of another 30000/- for the surgery to be done. They approached the medico-social department of Majumdar Shaw medical centre from where they found the sponsor, Sir Ratan Tata Trusts (SRTT) through Narayana Health CSR. SRTT had funded the remaining amount of 30000/- that is required for the surgery.

The surgery was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department & Sir Ratan Tata Trusts.

Maheswaramma

Mrs Mahershwaramma, a female aged 61 years is a resident of Siddrameshwara nagara, Kadur, Chikmangaluru, Karnataka, who is the wife of Late Gavi Rangappa, who have 2 children named Manu who is aged 28 years and is currently unemployed and a daughter named Deepa who is aged 25 years who is a radiology technician in Mazumdar Shaw cancer centre.

Daughter in law, is the bread winner of the family and the total family income is 13,680 per month. Mahershwaramma with MRN no. 10140000147375 was diagnosed with carcinoma cervix which has a high cure rate if treated on time. The treatment for her condition requires Chemo Therapy + Radiation Therapy + Brachy Therapy which would cost the family a total of 2,71,700/-. The family could collect 70,000/- by gathering funds & savings.

The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.

Baby Bhoomika


Baby Bhoomika, female aged 4 months is a resident of Gulbarga, Hirapur, Karnataka, she is the only daughter of Kedranath, and Preethi who are aged 38 and 28 years respectively and has a elder brother named Mallikarjun who is three years old.

Her father is a daily wage labourer who earns 12,000 per annum and is the sole source of income, to support the 4-member family. Baby Bhoomika with MRN no. 10020000938858 was diagnosed with Left renal tumor and requires CT biopsy for definitive diagnosis and a surgical excision of a tumour, which would cost the family 1,50,000/- rupees, nine times their annual which was beyond the paying capacity of the four-member middle socio economical family.



The family could contribute 50,000/- by gathering funds, savings and public insurance and needed another 50000/- for the surgery to be done. The family approached the medico-social department of Mazumdar Shaw Hospital from where they found the sponsors through Narayana Health CSR, Sir Ratan Tata Trust (SRTT). SRTT sponsored an amount of 50,000/- that is required for the treatment.

The treatment was performed successfully by the combined efforts of NH CSR department and Sir Ratan Tata Trust on time.



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
